

# 1920s

# 1930s

Bundanoon continues to flourish, with electricity arriving in 1929 and eventually powering the town, guest houses being built and growing in popularity, a flurry of double-storey shops in Railway Avenue as well as the Soldiers' Memorial Hall in 1934 were constructed.

HOLIDAY TOURIST TRAFFIC. BUNDANOON. Tuesday. More than 1.200 tourists travelled to Bundamon by train during the Christmas and New Year holidays. About 250 arrived by car. Hundreds of people were unable to obtain accommodation. The only accident reported was a collision between two cars on the Penrose Road at 1 a.m. on Sunday, owing to a heavy mist and dust. No one was injured.

A strong reception com mittee representing all sections of sporting and social interests in the town was appointed to manage affairs. A further meeting is set down for this week to further advance arrangements for the visit.

The grounds of "Kochester Park," the Bundanoon home of Mr. and Mrs. Manning, were made available for public inspection on Good Friday afternoon, the flower beds and kawns being a source of great admiration to visitors.

The need for shops, a school, churches and postal facilities soon led to the development of a village clustered around the railway station.


