11. Holy Trinity Anglican Church - 15 Church St



This 1905 stone building replaced the original timber church which opened in 1879 and was destroyed in a bush fire in 1904.

A cemetery is at the rear of the church.

12. Nancy Kingsbury Memorial Park - Anzac Pde



Donated in 1959 by the Kingsbury family in honour of their daughter, who died at a young age, the park is maintained by the Bundanoon Garden Club.

13. The Pill factory - 12 Anzac Pde



Built in 1896-98 by William Augustus ("Gus") Nicholas, it was here that he produced his range of Golden Cross homeopathic remedies. The building was later a guest house and a restaurant.

14. The Soldiers Memorial Hall - 3 Railway Ave



Built in 1934 in the art-deco style of the period by the local RSL sub-branch, the Hall is still the hub of the village, hosting concerts, films, dinners, meetings and many other events.

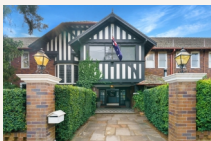
15. Bundanoon Railway Station



The station opened on 6 August 1868 as Jordans Crossing, was renamed Jordans Siding in 1878 and finally Bundanoon in 1881. The buildings were erected around 1910-15.

The station was a bustling place in the guest house era.

16. The Bundanoon Hotel - 6/18 Erith St



Two hotels have occupied this site. The original was opened in 1883 by Gus Nicholas. It had several names and in 1902 the name changed to The Royal Hotel, following the coronation of King

Edward VII. The present hotel was built in 1922 and the name was changed to Bundanoon Hotel in 1950.

17. Tennis Club - 70 Erith Street



The site in Erith Street where the Tennis Club is located was originally owned by Walter Grice. In the 1940s, Wingecarribee Council purchased the land for a sports ground. Prior to this time, tennis was played on private courts. Most guest houses had a tennis court. The Bundanoon Tennis Club moved to this site in the late 1940s. The current club house was built in 1983.

1. The Old Goods Shed



Built in 1884, the Shed served the growing population of the village, sending produce to Sydney and receiving food and other goods in return.

It is now the home to the Bundanoon History Group and houses its collection of historical records, images and artifacts.

2. Bundanoon Emporium - 15 Railway Ave



Originally a weatherboard building on a two-acre site, the Calverley family's Bundanoon Emporium later traded as a drapery. In 1968 it became the area's first supermarket, run by Richard and Shirley Tebbutt. It is now the Primula Cafe.

3. Paragon Cafe - 21 Railway Ave



Built as a café for Charles Panoretto in 1929, the Paragon Dance Studio opened upstairs the following year.

A general store from 1958 then Ducky's Diner operated here from 1973, until it became a Chinese restaurant in 1995.

4. The Third Post Office - 27 Railway Ave



The postmaster's residence and the third post office were built circa 1917.

The Post Office closed in 1958 when the present one was built. It has since been a café / restaurant under various names and a nursery.

5. The First Police Station - 31 Railway Ave



'Altona' was built in 1905 by the Calverley family to serve as Bundanoon's first Police Station. The first stationed police officer was in residence; stables and lockup out the back.

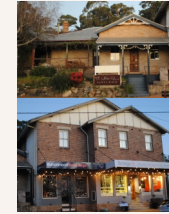
The Calverley family later moved into the building themselves.

6. Double Fronted Shops - 33 Railway Ave



Since around 1927 this has been a hairdresser, a billiard and gaming saloon, bike and golf hire, a magic shop in the 1970s, a general store in the 1980s and other uses since.

7. Willamurra & French Inn - 37/39 Railway Ave



Built in 1906 by Joseph Tooth. Guesthouse, then Jane Brown's late-night coffee shop, Pierre's nightclub, a pottery from 1980. No 37: Built 1926; accommodation; Bon Ton café; McVicker's restaurant; a steam laundry; an antique shop and a bakery.

8. Ye Olde Bike Shop - 11 Church Street



Built early 1900s, this building was variously Bundanoon's second Post Office, a general store and a bicycle hire and repair shop. The mural was added in 2002.

9. Uniting Church - 4 Church Street



The original Primitive Methodist Church, on the site now occupied by the Hall, was replaced by this building in 1885.

The adjacent cemetery has some of the earliest graves in the village.

10. Bundanoon School - 14 Church Street



In 1871, the Primitive Methodist Church was used on weekdays as Bundanoon Provisional School. In 1878, the site of the current school was purchased and in 1880 a teacher's residence was built with a schoolroom attached. In 1909, the present brick building was erected and contained two classrooms.
